Does the bed or chest help you determine its size?



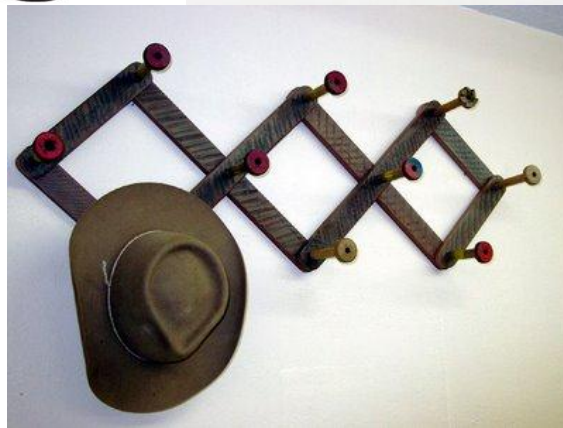
What is the purpose for the object?
